

# National Chengchi University Regulations for Cross-campus Course Selection in Taiwan

- Article 1 These regulations are established in accordance with the University Act and the enforcement rules of the University Act.
- Article 2 The University's students selecting courses of other campuses, or students from other campuses selecting courses of the University shall seek the approval of the competent department or college. The regulations shall be established by each department and college separately in addition to these regulations.
- Article 3 Interscholastic course selection should be allowed on the basis that one university between the two does not offer the course in question. Students who make interscholastic course selections across different departments or years are subject to the consent of the relevant departments.
- Article 4 To make interscholastic course selections, students are required to submit applications and complete procedures before the course selection deadline of the current semester. Applications need to be submitted to the Registration Section, Office of Academic Affairs. No course selection will be effected until the student completes the required procedures. NCCU students may select up to 6 credits worth of courses from other institutions per semester. Departments and institutes may set their own limits on the number of credits that students are allowed to earn via interscholastic courses throughout the program duration.
- Article 5 Students from other campuses selecting to take the University's courses shall pay the credit fee in accordance with the regulations; students shall also pay the internship fee for selected courses that include an internship. Students will be graded by their course instructors, who shall consolidate grades within normal deadlines to the Registration Section, Office of Academic Affairs, to have them forwarded to other universities.
- Article 6 The University's students shall conduct fee payment, class attendance, issuance of grades according to the regulations of the campus they select the courses from.
- Article 7 These regulations and any amendments shall be approved by the Academic Affairs Meeting, shall be submitted to the Ministry of Education for reference, and become effective after promulgation by the President.
