

National Chengchi University Regulations on the Implementation of General Education in Chinese Language Teaching

Amended and Approved on June 11, 2004 by the Academic Affairs Meeting;
Amended and Approved on June 6, 2016 by the 2nd Academic Affairs Meeting,
spring semester, Academic Year 2016;
Amended and passed on June 2, 2025 by the Academic Affairs Meeting in its 2nd Meeting of the
2nd Semester of the 2024 Academic Year.

- Article 1 To enhance students' Chinese language literacy, cultivate their reading ability, develop their language expressive skills, and strengthen their humanistic literacy, these regulations are hereby established in accordance with Article 5 of the National Chengchi University Regulations for General Education Courses.
- Article 2 Students are required to complete 3 to 6 credits in the Chinese domain, which includes Chinese courses on various topics and "Advanced Chinese."
- First-year students are required to take a 3-credit Chinese course on one topic. Upon passing, students may enroll in an additional Chinese course on a different topic or one "Advanced Chinese" course each semester. However, no more than a total of 6 credits may be counted toward graduation requirements.
- Article 3 Overseas Chinese and international students from programs other than the Department of Chinese Literature may be taught in separate classes. The Department of Chinese Literature shall select and use appropriate teaching materials for instruction.
- Article 4 Language expression training is incorporated in the implementation of the Chinese course instruction. This training may take the form of composition writing, group presentations, book reviews, practical writing, or other formats. Instructors may also assign additional coursework as needed for teaching purposes.
- Article 5 The semester grade for the Chinese courses must be based on at least three components: class participation, language expression training performance, and the final examination.
- Article 6 These regulations shall be promulgated and implemented following approval by the Academic Affairs Meeting. The same procedure shall apply to any amendments.
